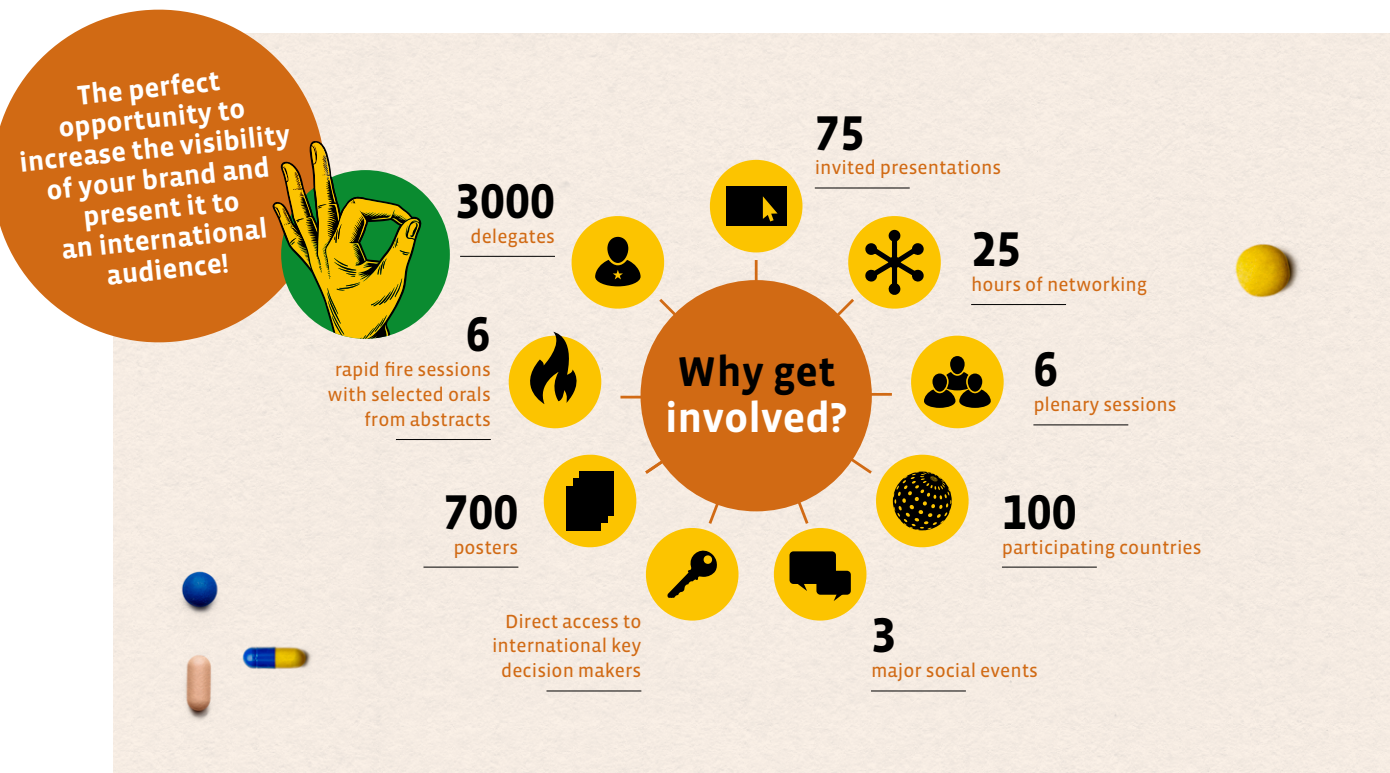


PHARMACY IN AUSTRALIA

Australia has more than 35,000 pharmacists, with more than 7,000 practising in Brisbane and other cities in the state of Queensland. Registered pharmacists work in many areas of the healthcare sector — community, hospitals, general practice, aged care, universities, government departments of health and the pharmaceutical industry.

Australian pharmacists' scope of practice is expanding. Opportunities such as specialty clinical positions, clinical trials and collaborative pharmacist prescribing will further their contribution to the health and well-being of Australians.
